It's amazing how one little taste of

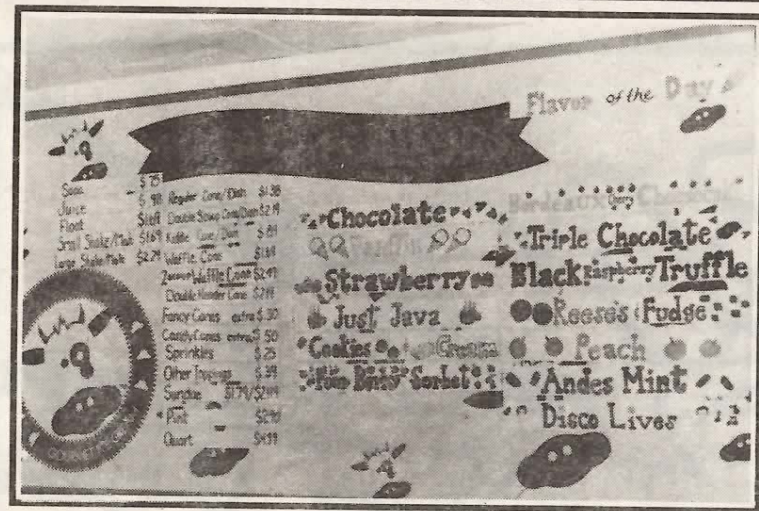
something can pull you back through the years and remind you of long summer days filled with eating ice cream as a kid.
