PLAYING IT COOL IN THE FALL

There are those who say ice cream is a summer food—a sweet meant to be savored when the temperature is hovering close to triple digits.

Of course, in Texas, that's a possibility almost through November. But if you need more incentive to eat ice cream when the temperature starts slipping, Milwaukee Joe's Gourmet Ice Cream supplies it, in the form of its new fall flavors.

A Bedford ice cream parlor that scoffs at the notion of a mere 33 flavors, Joe's has a rotation of more than a hundred flavors that pop up as flavor-of-the-day.

Fall favorites include pumpkin—a sweet cream base flavored with pumpkin and a touch of cinnamon, resulting in a thick, amber-colored concoction that's much more interesting than a regular old pumpkin pie. There's also eggnog, spiked with you-know-what; Bailey's Irish Creme; spice cake; Grand Marnier; and tiramisu.

A generous dip in a cup or cake cone is \$1.38. And for those who like to plan ahead, the store announces its flavor forecast a month in advance. Pumpkin, for instance, is next planned for Nov. 26—just in time for the post-Thanksgiving letdown.
